

# **Procurement Policy**

- **1. Purpose** To ensure the procurement of high-quality goods and services in a fair, ethical, and sustainable manner, supporting Terumo Aortic's mission to provide optimal aortic treatment solutions.
- **2. Scope** This policy applies to all procurement activities conducted by Terumo Aortic, including interactions with suppliers and other business partners.

## 3. Principles

# 3.5 Supplier Relationships

- Foster long-term, mutually beneficial relationships with suppliers.
- Encourage open communication and collaboration to achieve shared goals.

# 4. Supplier Guidelines

- All suppliers must agree to and comply with Terumo Aortic's Supplier Guidelines, which outline expectations regarding quality, ethical conduct, compliance, and sustainability.
- The Supplier Guidelines are available upon request and must be acknowledged by all suppliers before engagement.

#### 5. Responsibilities

- All employees involved in procurement must adhere to this policy and report any violations.
- The Procurement Department is responsible for implementing and monitoring compliance with this policy.
